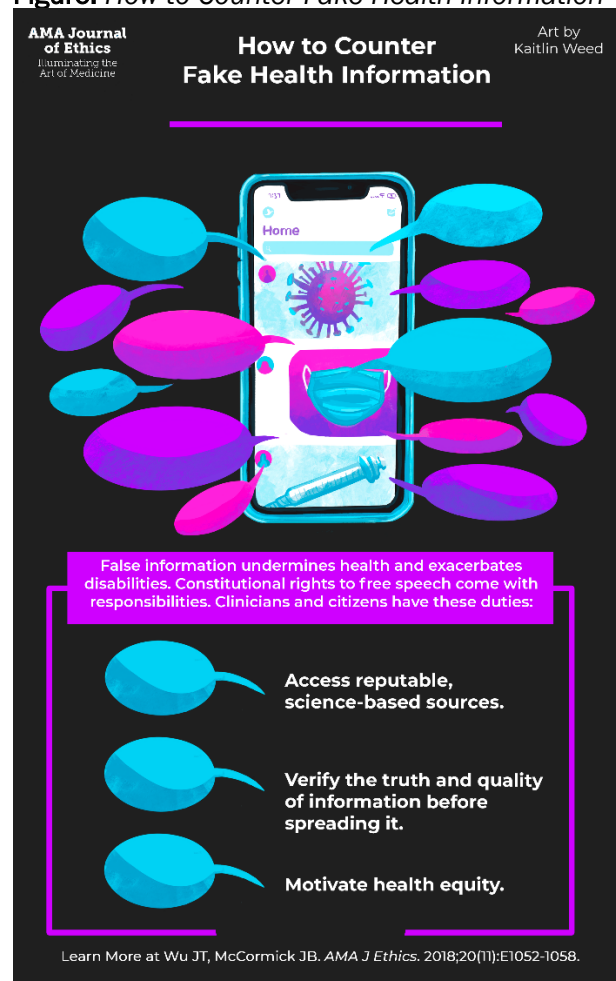
How to Counter Fake Health Information
